From today's Gospel reading:

Jesus said to his disciples: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given me. Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations."

Our Parish pledged to #WalkwithFrancis—donating to the Food Pantry is a good way to walk.


Are You Aware?
