Dear Friends,



As we approach the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, let us reflect on this profound mystery of our faith. According to the teachings of the Catholic Church and the beliefs held by Eastern Orthodox Churches, Oriental Orthodox Churches, the Church of the East, and some Lutheran and Anglo-Catholic communities, the Assumption celebrates the moment when the Mother of Jesus, Mary, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory at the end of her earthly life.

This solemn feast, celebrated on August 15th, is a significant event in the liturgical calendar and is recognized as a Holy Day of Obligation. This year, the feast falls on a Thursday, and I urge all faithful Catholics to attend Mass and partake in this sacred celebration. We will hold Mass at 8:45 AM and again at 7:30 PM. Please join us in receiving the blessings of the Virgin Mary.

The doctrine of the Assumption, which the Catholic Church upholds as dogma, was formally defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950, in his apostolic constitution, *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God). Pope Pius XII referenced Genesis 3:15, which speaks of Mary's victory over sin and death through her association with Christ, the new Adam. This is also reflected in 1 Corinthians 15:54: "...then shall come to pass the saying that is written: 'Death is swallowed up in victory.'"

Although the New Testament does not provide an explicit account of Mary's Assumption, various scriptural passages have been theologically interpreted to affirm the ultimate fate of the Mother of Jesus. We seek her intercession as we pray, "Mother Mary, pray for us."

Amidst the current challenges, including rising costs in groceries, gas, and electricity, our church continues to stand strong, thanks to your unwavering support. I humbly ask each one of you to consider increasing your contributions according to your means. Your generosity is not just appreciated, but it is also vital for the continued functioning and growth of our church. I cannot adequately express my gratitude for all that you do for us. Your contributions, no matter how big or small, make a significant difference.

Faith formation registration is currently open at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. I encourage all families to enroll their children to receive their sacraments, grow in their Christian faith, and develop a lifelong friendship with Jesus.



Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 11th, 2024 1 Kgs19:4-8; Eph 4:30-52; Jn 6:41-51

Our readings today continue to educate us on the Eucharist.

Jesus tells us in our Gospel that He is this Food that sustains us as He says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven...and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." This bread He is referring to is His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity that we receive. This bread becomes the flesh of Christ Himself.

And in consuming Him, we receive every grace we need to live forever in eternal life. We are strengthened in virtue and united more closely to Christ. This is the Food that will fill us as we journey through this life.

Mistakenly we often take the Eucharist for granted. Maybe we come to Mass to "check the box" instead of actively partaking in this intimate exchange or we receive Jesus in the Eucharist and then forget about Him the second we leave the church after Mass.

To receive all that God wants to give us in the Eucharist, we must do our part in being receptive to His grace and living out active discipleship in our day-to-day lives.

Let us approach the Lord acknowledging His Divine Presence and be open to all the graces He desires to pour out on us. Then we must go forth, being attentive to the moments that the Holy Spirit is calling us to act as He acts — in total love and sacrifice.

The Eucharist affects our lives more than we can comprehend. We are receiving God Himself. Let us strive to receive Him reverently and with open hearts.

Opportunities to Help & Volunteer


